## United Nations Conference on the Arms Trade Treaty

New York, 2-27 July 2012

### Report of the United Nations Conference on the Arms Trade Treaty

#### I. Introduction

1. In its resolution 64/48 of 23 December 2009, the General Assembly decided to convene a United Nations Conference on the Arms Trade Treaty to meet for four consecutive weeks in 2012 to elaborate a legally binding instrument on the highest possible common international standards for the transfer of conventional arms.

#### II. Organizational matters and proceedings of the Conference

##### A. Opening and duration of the Conference

2. The United Nations Conference on the Arms Trade Treaty was convened at United Nations Headquarters in New York from 2 to 27 July 2012. The Conference was opened and addressed on 3 July 2012 by the Secretary-General of the United Nations. At the same meeting, Roberto García Moritán (Argentina) was elected President of the Conference. Daniël Prins of the Office for Disarmament Affairs served as Secretary-General of the Conference. The Conference held plenary meetings and informal meetings. The list of participants is contained in document A/CONF.217/INF/1.

##### B. Rules of procedure

3. At its 1st meeting, on 3 July, the Conference adopted its rules of procedure (A/CONF.217/L.1).

4. Also at the 1st meeting, on 3 July, the Conference adopted the agenda (A/CONF.217/L.2) as follows:

## III. Credentials

7. Pursuant to rule 4 of the rules of procedure of the Conference (A/CONF.217/L.1), according to which the composition of the Credentials Committee shall be based on that of the Credentials Committee of the General Assembly at its sixty-sixth session, the Conference appointed China, Costa Rica, Egypt, Italy, Maldives, Panama, the Russian Federation, Senegal and the United States of America as members of its Credentials Committee.

8. At its 17th meeting, on 27 July, the Conference adopted the draft resolution recommended by the Credentials Committee in paragraph 14 of its report (A/CONF.217/3), thereby approving the report of the Credentials Committee. In that report, the Committee had accepted the credentials of the representatives of Member States to the Conference.

## IV. Report of the Conference to the General Assembly

9. At its 6th meeting, on 9 July, on the proposal of the President, the Conference approved its provisional programme of work for two weeks, from 9 to 20 July, by which it established two main committees, namely Main Committee 1, chaired by Bouchaib Eloumni (Morocco), and Main Committee 2, chaired by Paul van den Ijssel (Netherlands), to conduct negotiations on the elements of the arms trade treaty.

10. The Conference also held informal meetings from 6 to 27 July 2012.
11. At its 15th meeting, on 26 July, the President submitted, under his own responsibility and without prejudice to the position of any delegation, the text of a draft arms trade treaty contained in document A/CONF.217/CRP.1.
12. At its 17th meeting, on 27 July, the Conference adopted the present report by consensus.
